




And the last - Mike Sullivan gets the Spitfire's tail up quickly as the final aircraft leaves Watts

THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

By the time of reading it will be close to the AGM. Certainly all nominations will be in and you may be interested to know that incumbent Board of Management members will be offering themselves again for re-election.

It is timely to review the year that has past. One concern was the airfield valuation and while some relief has been gained, the burden largely falls upon air-The Board has field leaseholders. recently argued the case to State Development and SEQWC that valuation increases are the greatest drivers towards a large airfield as the creation of more leases seems the only realistic way of recovering these costs. As neither WBMA members nor SEQWC want a large airfield it would seem that curbing valuation increases is in the interests of both parties and should be treated as a

On a brighter note, we now face the imminent prospect of registering the leases thus making them secure. Also there is now agreement to have regular working meetings between Council, SEQWC and WBMA in order to advance the airfield.

In connection with the proposed land use plan I would encourage members to study the new airfield map that Rod Mill has drawn up for this issue. You will notice suggested nomenclature for all areas. Naming the precincts, taxiways, roads and lanes makes it easier for all to understand the nature of things on the airfield. Aeromodellers please note your proposed new runway alignments (originals are dotted) that are more in keeping with prevailing winds. Should there be aspects or names that concern members, please advise Rod who will be happy to take suggestions. Once we have agreement I'm sure we can persuade Richard to put it on the website.

Most realise that a lot of hard work has gone into 2004. I am confident that all of this will bear fruit in 2005.

It has certainly been a bumper year for flying events. These typify the energy and goodwill present at Watts Bridge. Don't forget our final one (see the ad in this issue): The Christmas Extravaganza on November 27. See you there.
