

Watch your step. The season has started.

Don't give the snakes a place to hide around your hanger.

- 1.Remove overgrown and creeping vegetation adjacent to hangar walls etc.
- 2.Remove all loose ground cover in the form of rubbish, sheets of tin, logs and rocks.
- 3.Remove all low branches from shrubs and trees so everyone can see what's under there.

Snakes will hide in any ground-level vegetation that straddles sunny and shady spots.

Finally, if you see a snake the best advice is move out of the way and leave it alone, don't take your eyes of the snake and stand at a safe distance (more than metres) out of it's way.
